1 THE RON SHORT WALK

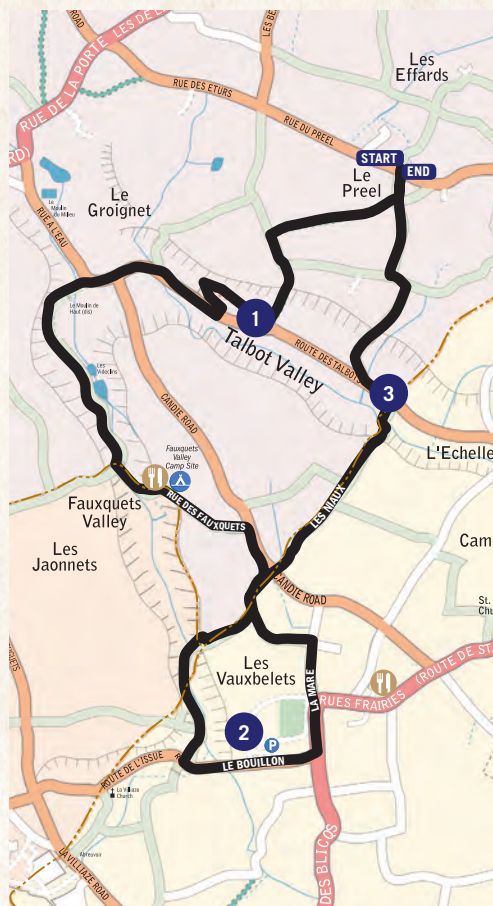
The Ron Short Walk has opened up rural vistas above the Talbot Valley that would otherwise be unseen and inaccessible. It was named after Ronald Short, founder of a centre for the disabled on the Island.

2 THE LITTLE CHAPEL

A work of art and a labour of love, the Little Chapel is possibly the smallest chapel in the world. It was built by Brother Déodat who started work in March 1914. His plan was to create a miniature version of the famous grotto and basilica at Lourdes in France. Beautifully decorated with seashells, pebbles and colourful pieces of broken china, there is a miniature altar and grotto.

3 THE OLD WATER MILL

The old water mill in Les Niaux was built in the early 1700s but there has been a water mill on the site since the 1300s.



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
